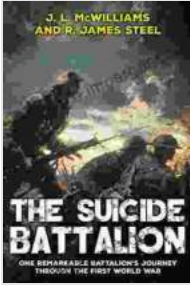
The Suicide Battalion

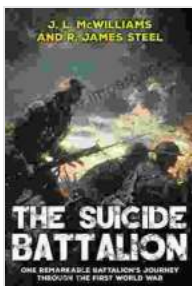

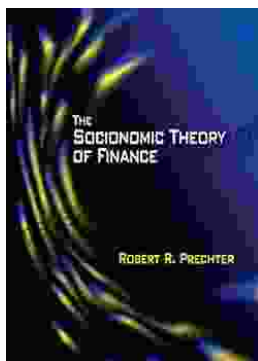
